

A prophet of Yahweh in the line of Seth who brought mankind through the Flood.




The "good" Kentaur (Seth-man) because he brought his wife, <u>Naamah</u>, of the line of Kain, through the Flood.

CHIRON/HAM




Born on his mother's side from the line of Kain, turned from Noah and Yahweh, embraced and spread Zeus-religion.





As Naamah's grandson, led the armed rebellion against Noah and his Yahwehbelieving children.




HERAKLES' REBELLION AGAINST NOAH

Here, Herakles pushes Noah aside.




And Athena rewarded the great hero after he had pushed Noah and his God out of the picture and reestablished the way of Kain.




12 Labors of Herakles


